



## Addendum and Guidelines to Perpetual Scholarship Fund

- US-based classmates who are currently sending their quarterly contributions are requested to stop their payments and resume payments according to the terms that they choose based on the Apple that they pledge. Please let us know your selection of your new pledge amount as suggested above as soon as possible. There is always an Apple available for everyone.
- Ongoing and future fundraising, whether individually, geographically or in group, are requested to send in their goals to "reserve" an Apple for them. Your Apple will be ready for pick up upon completion of your project.
- Promote the Apple Tree Gift Giving among your friends, families, officemates, retirees, non-profit associations that you belong to, fellow parishioners, at parties and meetings when appropriate. Share the success of our program and its benefits. Be creative and share your ideas.
- We are totally a volunteer group. 100% of the funds we raise goes to the Perpetual Fund.
- Detailed financial reports would be provided periodically, as well as the scholars' progress report.

### Fellow Klasmeyts,

It's been over a month since our 40th Grand Reunion in Manila and I still feel the excitement and camaraderie that I have experienced on those 3 Reunion Days. Perhaps, we could have stretched it for another week and still wouldn't be enough. And the tail-gate parties surrounding those days, just wonderful, very memorable and I will definitely cherish them for the rest of my life. Lina is kind enough to hear my stories being repeated everyday, while watching the videos, showing off the souvenir program and the digital pictures.



The first day of the Reunion has special meaning to me. Besides meeting our classmates and teachers I have not seen in 40 years, I finally met our scholars and their parents for the first time. It's an unbelievable feeling talking to the parents and hearing their never-ending appreciation for all the scholarships we have been providing their children. The beautiful faces of our scholars radiate signs of better future. The parents don't know exactly how to thank us, but they assure us that they are doing their best to keep their children worthy of our sponsorships. That assurance, I said to myself, is good enough.

We need to continue our project on a consistent, permanent foundation. When we first started this, we're kind of "testing the water." We did very good though, producing 13 scholars, fully funded in 2 years. The response/support is unheard of, unending and contagious. Pouring and sharing of creative ideas on how to raise funds keep coming and yielding incredible results.

Reality is, we're not getting younger and soon, we'll be joining the retiree section of the Baby Boomers.

We're ready to step up our efforts and build on reaching a Perpetual Scholarship Fund of P1-Million. A plan towards a more stabilized program which we have been toying for years and now seems to be the right thing to do. We now have a good track record, dependable manpower and a strong will that we will succeed. Experience tells us that a project with a noble cause such as ours will always succeed and we will!

### Here's the proposed plan approved by your Scholarship Committee:

Adopt the Apple Giving Tree concept to promote and achieve our goal (Apple Giving Tree Document & Detailed Suggestions on how to adopt an Apple on separate email to follow soon).

An Apple represents recommended pledge of \$375. We need 50 "Apple Donors or Sponsors" to meet our goal of P1-million or \$18,750.

Please don't be overwhelmed with the amount each Apple represents. Treat it as a tool to monitor our progress. If we have 25 Apples on the Tree, we know we're half way towards our goal. As a start up, we have 4 Apple Donors already, plus \$941 uncommitted funds in the treasury and another \$520 from the Afghan raffle or a total of \$1,461, almost equivalent to 4 Apples. Altogether, we have 8 Apples to begin this project, with 42 more to go!!!

You may obtain an Apple individually or in partnership with fellow classmates, friends, officemates or relatives. A fundraising project may buy an Apple or two. Or, save \$1 a day for a year (my personal preference) or give up something occasionally. These are few examples. Please feel free to share with the group your splendid ideas.

- Suspend sponsorship until we reach the P1-million Fund. This year, we already have 4 donors as follows: Dr. Rita Eustaquio, Palm Coast, FL, Manilabased batchmates Manny Balangue and Purificacion Caro-Lozada, and Jose S. Santos, Sr. Memorial Scholarship.
- Fundraisings, dues, assessments end as soon as we reach our goal.
- > Use the income from the P1million to pay for the scholars' expenses. The P1-Million Perpetual Fund will never be touched. Funds stay in the US until its disbursements.
- Form Committees that will administer the Fund.
- Provide smooth transition of the Fund in the event PCCH5 Class 65 can no longer provide effective management and administration.

So klasmeyts, hope you would embrace this class project with full support and kind heart and make a difference to the lives of talented and deserving PUPHS students. Hopefully, once we achieve this, its lasting benefits would echo thru the hallways and class rooms of PUP HS Laboratory Sta. Mesa Campus and encourage other batch years to emulate.

One last thing - 100% of your contributions goes to the Perpetual Fund. We are totally a volunteer group. This sets us apart from most fundraising activities where certain percentage of donations goes to administrative fees.

Thank you very much for your continuing support and the confidence and trust you have bestowed on us.
